Various aspects of Patent law are considered here, whether it be the classification of inventions (related or not to the assignment), the definition and outline of the employee/employer contractual relationship, recognition of the value added to or for the company or, alternatively, the requirement of an additional payment or compensation at the right price and depending on the case. Also covered are information technology inventions (software), copyright of the creation, multimedia works, and taxation on employee inventions, not to forget inventions by Public officials.


This book is based on the analysis of the principals and rights that underline employee inventions, accompanied by a comprehensive look at the jurisprudence.
